- Unofficial high school transcript (must have school and student information)
- Personal statement (300 words)
- Letter of recommendation
 (must be from a high school teacher or staff)

NM GCM Grosvenor Discovery Program

Part of the NM pipeline offerings since the 1990's

As part of Northwestern Medicine's commitment to building stronger, healthier communities, the mission of the Discovery Program is to create a pathway for the next generation of healthcare leaders. The program draws on the talents of NM healthcare professionals to provide STEM career exploration opportunities.

NM Discovery is designed for students with a strong interest in healthcare, but who may have limited access to career exploration opportunities.

Reach

The program currently serves nearly 200 students across 6 regions (Central, South, West, Northwest, Greater DeKalb and North).

Program Eligibility

Student Eligibility

- Be at least 15 years of age (16 for the internship)
- Be entering into sophomore or junior year of high school. (Seniors will be accepted on a limited basis)
- Have an academic GPA of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 scale

Internship Eligibility

- 2nd year Discovery student (Central Region)
- In good academic standing with 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Good record of attendance
- Completed application and essay responses
- Can commit to the summer program, timelines and policies



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

Volunteer Services Qualifications

Volunteers must:

- Be at least 16 years old
- Make a commitment of 12 months of service with a minimum of 8 hours each month
 or complete 100 hours (whichever comes first)
- Complete our online application
- View New Volunteer Orientation & complete quiz
- Complete a Medical health screening including a drug screening and health assessment
- Complete and pass a criminal background check




Parking stickers:




